INK PAD REFILL STORAGE

A unique way to store your inkpad refills is to use 3-ring case binders and Velcro.

Supplies:

- Case Binders 7.0 X 9.43 X 1.25
 (I bought mine at Univenture.com but the white has been discontinued. Any brand or size case binder will work. This size will hold 18 refill bottles.)
- Velcro
- Scissors
- Optional: Glass mat and craft knife



Using sharp scissors remove the binder rings.

Apply two strips of Velcro to one side of the inside of the binder leaving enough room so that the refill bottles do not stop the binder from closing.



Cut small strips of Velcro and attach to the back of refill bottles.

Make sure that you will be able to see the color name of refill when you stick the bottle to the binder Velcro.

Hint:

I found it was easier to cut the small pieces of Velcro by removing the backing from the Velcro, stick it onto a glass mat and cut the individual pieces.

In this picture, I've cut the Velcro into ½" pieces. I removed one piece so you could see the sizing.

Originally, I cut each piece and then removed the backing. It was too tedious and I found this was much easier even though the Velcro sticks to the glass. To remove the Velcro form the glass, lift the edge of the Velcro with your craft knife.



I note "Ret" on the refill bottle to indicate that the color is retired.

The color name on light colors are hard to read (ex. Blush Blossom, Barely Banana, etc) I use a black Sharpie to rewrite the name so I can read it.

If you lay the binders on its side, be sure to close tightly the bottles to prevent leaks.
