

# pretty paper *tea set*

## you'll need

### Papers & Embellishments

- Mission Lampshade Papermaking & Tracing Template (Arnold Grummer's).
- White vellum Bristol paper.
- Lt. green card stock.
- Flower Additions Blue Pre-braded Flowers, 1", four (Heidi Grace).
- Silver mini brads, six.

### Tools & Supplies

- Silver Leafing Pen.
- Paper Finishes Make It Pearl!® spray paint (Krylon®).
- Hole punch, 1/16".
- Mini-pinking shears.

## what to do

### Teapot

1 Spray paint Bristol paper. Use lampshade template to trace around openings on Bristol paper, drawing outline four times for four sides of pot. Cut out shapes. 2 Punch two holes in one side of pot, 7/8" from top and bottom edges, centered from side to side for teapot handle. Punch hole in center of adjacent side for flower. To assemble pot, glue flaps to back of shapes. (Note: Narrower end of pot is bottom.) 3 **Print and cut out patterns.** Cut bottom teapot shape from Bristol paper. Score and fold along dashed lines. Glue flaps inside bottom of teapot sides. 4 Cut teapot handle shape from Bristol paper. Score and fold along dashed lines. Punch holes in handle at dots indicated on pattern. Attach silver brads through holes in handle and pot. 5 Cut spout shape from Bristol paper, following pattern. Score and fold along dashed lines. Glue side flap inside side (A) to make spout shape. Gold and glue bottom flaps on top of each other. Glue bottom flaps to side of teapot opposite handle. 6 Attach flower brad to hole in center of side. Use mini-pinking



project sizes: cup, 2½" tall; teapot, 6½" tall

shears to cut two leaves from green card stock. Score a line down center of each leaf and fold. Glue leaves angled under flower at sides. 7 For lid: cut four lid shapes from Bristol paper. Use leafing pen to draw line across bottom of shapes, ¼" from edges. Score along dashed lines. To assemble, glue flaps to back of shapes. Attach flower brad to opening at center top of lid.

### Tea Cup

1 Assemble teacup in same way as teapot (eliminating spout and lid), trimming sides 2½" from bottom, drawing silver lines ¼" from top edge of each side, and using teacup handle pattern.
